In sections 1 to 5, tops are to be removed 1" above the root.

20. A truss of cherry tomatoes, (A truss is a cluster of fruit growing at the end of a single stalk)
21. 1 pot parsley – 1 plant only

22. Dill, 3 stalks displayed in water
23. Plate of 5 pods, yellow beans
24. Plate of 5 pods, green beans
25. 2 Cucumbers, green for table, English Type
26. 2 Cucumbers, green for table, **VARIETY NAMED.**
27. Pickling cucumbers, 4 on a plate, 4 ¼” to 6”
28. 1 litre pickling cucumbers, 3 to 4”
29. 3 Ears of corn, ready for table, more than 8 rows
30. 2 Muskmelons/cantelopes
31. 2 Citrons
32. 2 Pie Pumpkins, tied together
33. 5 Stalks rhubarb, crown and 1” leaf left on, bundled
34. 3 Green peppers, sweet
35. 3 Peppers, any kind, 3 colours, shown on a plate
36. 2 Kohlrabi, 2 to 3” in diameter, trimmed
37. 1 Squash, Hubbard, any variety
38. 2 Squash, Acorn or Pepper, white or dark
39. 2 Squash, Butternut
40. 2 Table Zucchini under 9”
41. 2 Squash, named, any variety, other than section 37 – 40
42. 1 Halloween Pumpkin
43. **NEW** – 2 Miniature ornamental pumpkins, e.g. sweetie, jack be little, baby boo, usually less than 5” in diameter
44. 3 Gourds on a plate, similar or mixed variety
45. 5 potatoes on a plate, any variety, named, late, e.g. Kennebec, Chieftan, Green Mountain, Russet, Sabego
46. 5 potatoes on a plate, red, named
47. 5 potatoes on a plate, any variety, named, early, e.g. Norland, Superior, Irish Cobbler
48. 5 Yellow fleshed potatoes on a plate, named
49. Largest one specimen, any variety, first place prize awarded only a judge’s discretion
