

LIGHT HORSE SHOW

1. Rider ages as of January 1, 2011.
2. Each exhibitor must use a separate entry form.
3. The general rules for Renfrew Fair shall apply in all cases.
4. Stalls to be allotted in the order of receiving entries and no stalls will be allotted without a paid entry and stall fee.
5. No bedding will be provided.
6. Classes will be shown in the order they are scheduled on the program.
7. Governed by C.E.F. rules for English.
8. For all events, including warmup, proper helmets and footwear must be worn whenever mounted. The riding helmets must be CSA approved and have a fixed harness. The footwear must have a one inch heel. This rule included non-competitors who are warming up or schooling horses.
9. All exhibitors must be members of the Renfrew Agricultural Society. 2011 membership fee is \$5.00 and must be paid before start of show. When prize money is being dispersed, a deduction of \$5.00 will be made for the 2012 membership fee.
10. All animals must have proof of a negative Coggins Test within the current year to be shown at the office when picking up numbers.
11. Exhibitors must be in the ring at the time classes are called or their entries will be refused. This rule will be strictly enforced by the Whipper-in.
12. All riders mounted on horses must wear competitor's number.

Entries must be received by Friday, August 19, 2011. However, entries can also be made on the day of the show up to the start of the day's show. NO ENTRIES WILL BE TAKEN AFTER THE START OF THE SHOW.

For the purpose of Friday's show, Western riders **MUST** also wear a CSA approved helmet or they will be asked to leave the show ring. **NO** exceptions!

English Tack: English saddle and snaffle bridle with a noseband
Western Tack: Western saddle & bridle. Snaffle bits are permitted.

Class 1 & 2 may only cross enter into Class 13.

Classes 3 – 8 may only cross enter into Class 13.

Any rider entering in the walk/trot classes may not enter any classes that require cantering.

Beginner – 1st or 2nd year riding. Based on the rider, not the horse.

Junior – 17 years old and under

Senior – 18 years old and over

Open – open to all age levels.

Any rider showing in the beginner level may not cross-enter into the other levels.

CLASS

1. Walk/Halt Command (may have a leader)
2. Obstacle Course (may have a leader)
3. Walk/Jog Equitation
4. Walk/Jog Western Pleasure
5. Walk/Trot Equitation
6. Walk/Trot Pleasure
7. Trotting Pole Course (English or Western tack)
8. Timed Obstacle Course
9. Western Equitation – must be able to lope
10. Western Pleasure – must be able to lope
11. English Equitation – must be able to canter
12. English Pleasure – must be able to canter
13. Apple Bobbing Relay Race – Teams of 4 riders. First rider must walk or trot (may be led). Cantering of the first rider will cause elimination of the team.
14. Musical Sacks – When music stops, rider must dismount and lead their horse to an empty sack. English or Western
15. Picture Relay – Team of 4 riders. First rider will draw the name of an animal that the team must draw. Riders can discuss amongst themselves but not amongst other team members or the crowd. First rider - must walk or trot. They may be led. They draw the head. Cantering will cause elimination. Second Rider – can only trot – they draw the body. Third Rider – can canter – they draw the legs. Fourth Rider – can canter – they finish the picture. Time stops when rider 4 crosses the line. Fastest times with judge being able to identify the animal wins. Judge identifies the animal when all relay teams have completed.

16. Ride a Buck – We will place a piece of paper under the rider once they are mounted bareback. The last rider to have their piece of paper wins the class. No chaps will be permitted.
